CHILDREN'S MISSION ACTIVITIES

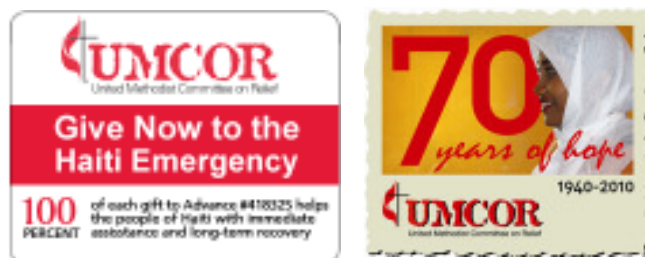

Children's Ministry Opportunity ***Health Kits for Haiti***

Thank you for the wonderful response to the plea for health kits in January. The kits are now on their way to be made available to the victims of the earthquake in Haiti. The children will be assembling additional health kits at the Mission Celebration March 12 -14. They will be working with a staff person from UMCOR-NGO who will be here for the Mission Celebration. UMCOR-NGO provides the logistics for distribution of these kits once they arrive at their destination. We are asking the congregation to assist the children of First Broad Street with this opportunity by bringing items for the health kits so that the children have them available for the Mission Celebration. Thank you for your continued support of the work of UMCOR and the mission opportunities you provide for the children of the congregations. Please bring the items below to the Health Kit Box near the Chapel through March 12.

- 1 hand towel (15" x 25" up to 17" x 27". No kitchen towels.
- 1 washcloth
- 1 comb (large and sturdy, not pocket-sized)
- 1 nail file or fingernail clippers (no emery boards or toenail clippers)
- 1 bath-size bar of soap (3 oz. and up)
- 1 toothbrush (single brushes only in original wrapper, no child-size brushes)
- 6 adhesive plastic strip sterile bandages

(NOTE: Toothpaste is purchased in bulk to be added to health kits to ensure that the product does not expire before they are sent.)
