## Children’s Ministry Opportunity -- *Health Kits for Haiti*



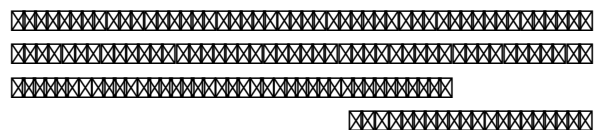

Please bring the items below to the Health Kit Box near the Chapel through March 12.

- 1 hand towel (15” x 25” up to 17” x 27”. No kitchen towels.
  - 1 washcloth
  - 1 comb (large and sturdy, not pocket-sized)
  - 1 nail file or fingernail clippers (no emery boards or toenail clippers)
  - 1 bath-size bar of soap (3 oz. and up)
  - 1 toothbrush (single brushes only in original wrapper, no child-size brushes)
  - 6 adhesive plastic strip sterile bandages
- (NOTE: Toothpaste is purchased in bulk to be added to health kits to ensure that the product does not expire before they are sent.)

**GOOD NEWS ITEMS**

1. Lawrence Collier announced the birth of his new baby boy, Wade Nelson.
2. Gail Preslar shared that the Middle School youth shared during Sunday School that they had a great Resurrection weekend and several were hearing God's call on their life.
3. Danny Howe stated that it has been confirmed that the Keynote Speaker for the Missions Celebration Weekend will be Rev. Jim Gulley. He replaces Sam Dickson who lost his life in the Haiti earthquake. Jim was with Sam in Haiti.
4. Mike McIntire shared that the Epiphany party was a really special evening.
5. Ashley Dukart shared that the high school Resurrection was a huge success.

**NEW MEMBERS – Janet Batts** – Janet circulated several handouts of new members, including individuals and families.

**DISTRICT UPDATE – Les Heaton** – Les attended the District Assessment session and shared some surprising statistics about attendance of United Methodist Churches in our conference. First Broad Street's glory days were between 1968 and 1970's. He shared a couple of challenges for our church to think about – 1) Return to Growth – point people to Christ and 2) Focus on People.

**40/50 DAYS OF PENTECOST – Janet Batts and Buddy Bounds** – The Holston Conference Witness Team shared a vision at Annual Conference to celebrate 3000 baptisms on Pentecost Sunday (May 23, 2010). **BEQUEST - Mike McIntire and Council** – Mike informed the Council that a substantial bequest has been given to the governing body of First Broad Street UMC. Discussion ensued. The settlement of the estate will take some time; therefore, a decision on the disbursement of the bequest will be dealt with upon receipt of actual amount – in God's timing!

**STATUS OF PROPOSED MEETING DATE CHANGE – Mike McIntire and Council** – The concept of switching day of the month with Staff-Parish did not pan out; therefore, the meeting day will continue to be the first Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. A finance report will be e-mailed to the Council when it is available.

1. The Leadership Academy starts Thursday, February 4.
2. The cancelled Lightning Charlie Concert fundraiser for Sudan has been rescheduled for March 11, at 7:30 p.m., at First Broad Street. It is the Thursday night of the Sudan Summit.
3. Les asked that we put May 23, 24, & 25 on our calendars for the Pentecost Celebration, as well as April 12, 13, & 14 for the revival at St. Mark's United Methodist Church that will be led by Bishop Swanson.

**CLOSING COMMENTS BY SENIOR PASTOR – Clark Jenkins** – Clark informed the Council that discussions are being held on developing a community garden. After convening with the Trustees and the City of Kingsport a report will be forthcoming.

**BENEDICTION** – Andrew closed with prayer. The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 p.m.

## Winter Is Not a Four-Letter Word

I made this comment the other day and someone replied, "That's true, but snow and cold are." We are indeed blessed in East Tennessee with four distinct seasons of about equal length. Our winters are usually mild with only short periods of really cold weather or significant snows. It has been a number of years since we have experienced a winter with a couple of months of cold weather along with several significant snows. As best I can tell, it doesn't do any good to complain about the weather, but most of us do it anyway.

The winter weather has had some significant impacts on our Church. Our utility bills for the last two months are higher than we have ever experienced. Our last two electric bills have topped \$10,000 which is our total utility budget. When natural gas and water bills are added, our utility costs are several thousand dollars above what we budgeted and what we experienced last year. This has caused us to look at ways we can reduce our utility usage. We have lowered temperatures a little and are trying to lower them further in rooms or spaces that are not in use. I know that a lot of the church has felt cool most of the time (this may explain why Clark has been seen wearing his overcoat the last week or two). The cold weather and our utility bills have also reminded us that we have a lot of old doors and windows that contain single pane glass and that are not well sealed. The cold that comes in around windows and doors is certainly costing us a lot of money. We are beginning to look at ways that we can improve these situations.

Probably our biggest culprits for letting cold air in are the glass entry doors off the alley. They don't close rapidly and they are not sealed well. We have long known that we needed a double set of doors at this location, and it is amazing how God works in our lives. Sam Loflin of Freeman Glass approached the Trustees with a proposal to donate entry doors with automatic openers and a glass enclosure to accomplish this much needed improvement. The Church will need to provide electricity to operate the doors, leveling of the entry floor, and some carpet. The Trustees quickly accepted this very generous offer, and we are working on plans to get this installed. If you see Sam, please be sure and thank him for this generous offer that he is doing in honor of some important people in his life.

The cold weather has kept most of us inside, but this has resulted in getting the hallways and a couple of classrooms under the Sanctuary painted. It always amazes me what a little paint can do for the appearance of an area. With the painting skills of Tom Brock, Bill Clapp, Jim Cornell, Larry Foster, Roger Hanz, Bill Howle, Alice Kirk, Gary Lodien, Foy McIntosh, Doreen Paul, Ron Paul, Gary Popwell, Jerry Repass, B. J. Reeves, and Bob Viers; this space looks so much better. Gary Lodien is going to be installing some new doors on the rooms. Now if we could just find some money for carpeting, and this space would look new.

My calendar suggests that spring is officially only three weeks away. We should soon be able to put up our toboggans and look back on the beauty of falling snow. Spring is mighty
