Where are we going? ...

Our Youth in Action--May 9

Where is God leading you? How often do you sit and think, "God, what is my next step? Where am I going?" This question may seem reasonable, but do any of us actually ask it? We always want to know which direction our company is heading, or where our finances are going. We even keep up with our favorite sports team to know if they are positioning themselves to win. For those of you with children, I know you take extra care to make sure they are going in the proper direction — that is why you have all those rules, right!

People typically like to know where they are going. The only problem is, we sometimes forget to ask God's thoughts on a situation. Most of us have a good idea on how to get somewhere; however, maybe the place we are trying to go is not where we need to be. The same is true for a youth group.

A few years ago God began to move us in a different direction. To a place where youth were expected to be the church, not just go to church. Despite their age, they have been counted on as leaders, programmers, and ministers. It has been amazing to see what has taken place. Ministries have formed and been shepherded by youth. We have youth organizing Mission projects, leading worship, starting Bible studies, writing devotions, creating Christian media, tutoring, and so much more.

There are many reasons why this is happening. One of the biggest is that, once we began moving in this direction, a certain mentality began to develop when it comes to church. We are moving away from creating future pew warmers to cultivating mature Christian disciples who have something to give back to the church.

Now are we doing it perfectly? No. We still have a long way to go and many other areas to address. God is still teaching and leading us. As we follow, there will be some bumps on the road; yet, we are seeing some amazing things happen!

One example is the Future Ministers group. This group of students all feel God calling them to a lifetime of Christian service. Some sense they should become pastors, youth ministers, worship leaders, or missionaries. They have studied together, learned what it takes to be a leader in the church, and talked about their hopes for the future. After almost two years together, they are prepared to live out an important role of ministry — sharing the Gospel.

On May 9, the youth are taking over! The seniors from the Future Ministers group will preach in all 5 services. If you attend a traditional service, you will hear the Youth choir and in contemporary worship, the Youth Jam Band will lead. Each will showcase a year of practice, hard work, and a love for leading others in the praise of our Lord Jesus Christ.

From liturgist to ushers, youth will be everywhere. There may be some missteps, but I am sure you will witness a group of young people passionate about Christ!

There are also some other exciting things ahead. Next year we will have two students in charge of our "Youth Active in Missions" team, YAM. Our youth will serve on John's Island and in Saltville this summer. Our worship service, Project 217, will take on another level of focus. We will be engaged in local projects this summer — from home repair to VBS at a nursing home. Plus, all the seniors from our Future Ministers group will travel to Seoul, Korea in July to attend the World Methodist Youth Conference. These are exciting times!

Increasingly, the youth group is faithfully asking, "God lead us in the direction we should go." On May 9, you will witness a glimpse of the journey they are on. — Jarrod Suits

Welcome to Our Friends From Yei, Sudan

We extend a warm welcome to our friends from Yei, Sudan who arrived in Kingsport on April 28th and will be our guest through May 24th. Godwill Soro Eliaba, Candiru Lilly Thomas, and Asega Joseph James are planning staff with the government of Yei and are here to work with the planning department of the City of Kingsport to develop a Land Use Plan for Yei, Sudan. Having a Land Use Plan created will allow them to be eligible for grants from humanitarian aid groups for infrastructure, etc. Most of the infrastructure of southern Sudan was destroyed during the almost fifty years of civil war after gaining their independence from Great Britain and Egypt in 1956. Now that peace has settled on southern Sudan, thousands of Sudanese are returning to their homeland, thus creating an urgent need for the establishment of infrastructure in the way of roads, sanitation, communications, electricity, water, healthcare, and education. The partnership between Kingsport and Yei will help make possible the progress needed for the town of Yei to offer their people a life that brings hope for the future.

They are staying in the apartment over the Cox Building and will be in the life of the church while visiting. Please help us welcome Lilly, Joseph, and Godwill to the United States, Kingsport, and to First Broad Street United Methodist Church. We also invite you to join them as the guest speakers for the May 17 United Methodist Men's gathering. A MESSAGE
FROM THE BUSINESS ADMINISTRATOR

FBSUMC'S Scholarship Program

It always amazes me when I think about all the ministries and programs that First Broad Street conducts in our Church, in our community and around the world. I want to take today's column and tell you about our scholarship program and what it has helped accomplish the last ten years. I also want to speculate about the future.


Our scholarship program has two parts: undergraduate college tuition assistance and Christian Vocation (Seminary) tuition assistance. Undergraduate college tuition assistance is the largest of these programs. In the last ten years, we have made 249 payments totaling \$122,302 in tuition assistance for students attending 22 colleges and universities. While early in this ten year period, some of this support was for graduate studies, it has been restricted to undergraduate support for the last three years. We have seen the number of students seeking assistance steadily grow over this period to where it is double what it was in 2000. At the same time the amount of funds available has decreased. In 2009, funds were about 30% less than in 2000. This has forced the Memorial – Scholarship Committee to reduce scholarship awards from nominally \$500 per semester to \$300 per semester at a time when the costs for a college education has risen faster than inflation.

The Memorial – Scholarship Committee has two sources of funds for college scholarships: the General Memorial and the Scholarship Memorial designated accounts. The General Memorial is the primary source. Gifts to the General Memorial Fund have decreased over the last ten years; but not because memorials and in honor gifts have declined. These gifts have gone up, but more of them have been directed to specific funds such as the Building, Friendship Diner, etc.

Our Christian Vocation Scholarship Fund has supported eleven students attending Seminaries over the last ten years with total tuition assistance of \$63,193. This fund was established with a substantial bequest in 1994. Unfortunately, the bequest was not so large that it could generate enough interest to support the scholarship needs and the principal has steadily eroded over the years. The initial fund was about \$120,000. It had declined to \$74,631 in 2000 and had fallen to \$35,852 at the end of last year even though there have been some gifts to it through the years.

I am usually reluctant to speculate about the future, but the trends are fairly obvious. We can anticipate increasing needs for scholarship assistance and a decreasing to steady availability of funds to support these needs. This is an even stronger trend with the Christian Vocation Scholarships. We are currently blessed to have about ten youth that are planning a Christian vocation and several students that are beginning their Seminary studies. We need to do what we can to support their call to ministry through our prayers as well as our gifts.

Please be in prayer for the Memorial – Scholarship Committee which included David Atkinson, Chair, Wes Boggs, Donna Deason, Connie Eaton, Kevin Martin, and Nancy Walker as they work to distribute scholarships to our young adults in

College Scholarship Program

The College Scholarship Program at FBSUMC is funded by gifts to the Scholarship Memorial and the General Memorial Fund Designated Accounts. The Christian Education Scholarship is funded by a bequest. Criteria for scholarship assistance include financial need, a desire to learn, and maintenance of at least a "B" grade point average while carrying a normal course load. Financial need is becoming an increasingly important factor because of an increasing number of applicants and diminishing funds available to support scholarships.

Students wishing to apply for scholarship assistance for the fall term should submit an application to the Memorials and Scholarship Committee by Friday, June 4, 2010. Applications are available in the Church Office. Completed applications should be returned to the church to the attention of Mike McIntire, Business Administrator. A new application is required each school year.

An applicant who receives scholarship assistance must provide a copy of his/her grades at the end of each semester to the Business Administrator in order to initiate the payment of the scholarship for the next semester. If you have any questions, please contact Mike McIntire at 224-1511.
