Healing by Second Intention . . .

“Once more Jesus put his hands on the man’s eyes.”
Mark 8:25

In medicine, we use the term, “second intention” to talk about true healing—when a wound heals from the inside out. If a wound closes up without healing well on the inside, it will eventually open back up and cause the process to start over—a complicated and frustratingly long ordeal.

In the miracle referred to above, Jesus touches the blind man twice. The first time, he doesn’t see clearly, but with the second touch all is well. Why did Jesus heal this man in this way? I don’t know but maybe it communicates to us that sometimes we experience true healing in stages, not all at once as we sometimes wish.

In our lives, in our churches, in our communities, we often see things get patched up without true healing taking place. By “dressing” the wound without fully addressing the problem, we end up burying it. The result is peace, but it is peace without true healing. Peace without justice is not real peace, it is burial. With burial comes necrosis, stench, decay—all side-effects of times when we try to smooth things over without really experiencing healing of the root problem.

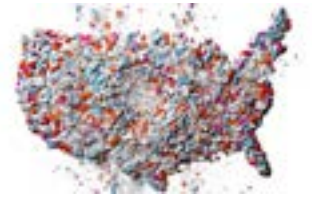
As we care for one another in a congregational setting, let us seek out true healing by promoting the practices associated with it: confession, prayer, communion, social action-- love in practice.

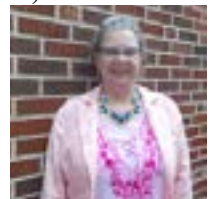

A Word from Our Lead Pastor . . .



There's a Presbyterian minister that I've heard preach several times over the years. His name is Steve Brown, and he is one incredible communicator. He tells the story of the death of his brother, who was his best friend.

If I recall correctly, his brother was a lawyer in North Carolina and died suddenly from a heart attack while in his forties.

Steve, whose home is in Florida, flew immediately to be with his brother's family. After the burial and a few days to visit, Steve decided it was time to

return home. He had rented a car and decided to drive to the cemetery for one last opportunity to pay his respect for his brother before catching the flight home.



When he arrived at the cemetery, it was raining hard . . . that cold, mountain, winter rain of North Carolina. He got out of the car and began to look for the grave. There were several fresh graves, and they all looked alike. Since they were new, they were without markers. He walked around for several minutes and was very quickly drenched to the bone.

Finally he cried out, "God, I've lost my best friend, my only brother . . . and now, I can't even find the grave!" In the quiet of the moment, a still small voice seemed to whisper, "Why do you seek the living among the dead?"
