## A Word from Our Lead Pastor . . .

Bill Bright, the late founder of Campus Crusade for Christ, once said that, “Contrary to what many, even believers, often think, Christianity is not a penalty that one has to endure in order to qualify for heaven, but rather an incredible adventure which has no equal.” I have to say that serving as your Lead Pastor for the past year has been one awesome adventure! Beth and I felt welcomed from day one . . . and before. The first sermon I preached at both the traditional and contemporary services was titled, “The Shadow of God,” using Acts 5 as my primary Scripture. In that particular Scripture, we see how people laid their sick in the streets so that Peter’s shadow might fall on them. They believed that the presence of God was so real in Peter’s life that even his shadow had healing properties. Time and time again this year, I’ve seen you cast the very Shadow of God, which has resulted in lives being changed in our community and world. ## Middle School Mission Team Headed to Chilhowie, Virginia

The Middle School Youth will be heading to Chilhowie, Virginia, for their annual mission trip this year, July 10-15. We have worked with Project Crossroads in relocation of the communities served in order to have a facility large enough for the expected increase in numbers of youth who will participate this year. Our housing location for many years, Madam Russell UMC in Saltville, will no longer house our team due to its increased size.
