## <u>Saturday, October 21, 9:30 AM</u>-Bus Trip to Elizabethton for Visit with Fruitcake Man, Lunch at Big Dan's Barbecue and Tour of Carter Mansion

Leave the First Broad Street UMC **Wanola St.** parking lot (behind the Downtown Flower Shop) at 9:30 AM. Visit with Tom McCloud, the 85-year old fruitcake man who bakes 2000 fruitcakes and 3000 dozen peanut butter cookies each year at his house to raise money for his church. Since 2007 Tom has raised \$174,000 through his creations and he usually gives more than half of his cakes to schools and food pantries. Plan to purchase some of his delicious goodies (fruitcake, \$14; cookies, \$3/dozen). Big Dan's varied lunch menu includes hamburgers, smoked pork, beef, chicken, ribs, house-made chips and burnt ends (charred brisket). Key lime and peanut butter pie (\$3) are tasty desserts. Prices-sandwich and 1 side-\$7, sides-\$2, garden salad-\$5.50. After lunch, visit the Carter Mansion, built between 1775 and 1780, the oldest frame house still standing in TN, the 1<sup>st</sup> in TN with glass windows and the home of both John and Landon Carter and their wives (both named Elizabeth). Cost: Bus \$2; Carter Mansion \$5; lunch and fruitcake/cookie purchases on your own. Potential total cost could be ~\$40. Back to Kingsport around 4. Sign up Mondays or call Jane (423 246-1727).
