### Mission Team Traveled to Cherokee, NC

It has been almost two years since a mission team from First Broad Street has traveled outside of Kingsport due to the Pandemic. Partnering with Cherokee Tribal Council and Cherokee United Methodist Church, protocols were established that enabled us to resume our mission ministry once again with the people on the Qualla Boundary through assisting in providing firewood for the winter. It was an emotional moment when the box truck was loaded, and we looked at the provisions packed before the door was pulled down...” we are traveling in mission once again”.

First Broad Street was joined by folks from other parts of Holston, South Carolina, and West Tennessee for the week, all celebrating our ability to join together in mission and fellowship. We joined people from Wolf Town and Big Cove communities, in the woodpile and around the table. We thank God for the opportunity to return to the mission field in traveling and thank First Broad Street for the patience and support to warm hearts and homes once again.

### Johns Island College Mission Trip Application

The College Mission Trip to Johns Island, South Carolina is scheduled for Monday, December 27th through Sunday, January 2nd. This trip is open to all college students and the cost per person is \$100.00, which covers housing and meals. To ensure that we are being responsible in our time together and considerate of the residents on the Sea Islands, we ask that you (1) provide proof of vaccination OR (2) provide proof of a negative COVID test within 48 hours of departure (COVID test cannot be an at home test). Registration is due in by Monday, Dec 13th.

The team will be repairing homes on the Sea Islands. We will also celebrate the New Year in Low Country style. We will be sleeping at St Johns Parish. ## Holiday Food Bag Drive

The annual Holiday Food Bag Drive will run through Sunday, January 2nd. This ministry opportunity is an excellent way for families, individuals, and small groups to have a personal experience of placing food on the table of someone who is physically hungry and in need of love, grace, and hope.

We have made some changes to the process for the drive this holiday season due to Covid 19. We want to ensure that all can participate, even those who may be in the vulnerable demographic and are not yet attending worship. So, we are offering three ways for participation as follows:

1 - We will have bags available at the church as you enter and leave worship on Sunday mornings, as well as cart in the entryway to place the bags when they are full. This will be present in both the main entrance as

well as the Wesley Wing entrance. The list of ingredients will be stapled to the bags.

2 - For those who are not attending worship, you can pick up a bag from the church on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 2:00-4:00 pm or take the list of ingredients with this article and purchase the items and ask for a paper bag as you check out. Drop off is available on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 2:00 – 4:00 pm at a cart in the main entrance to the church, or as you attend worship on Sunday morning. Following is the list of ingredients for the bags:

- 1 Protein such as Spaghetti Sauce with Meat and Noodles or Tuna and Mac & Cheese
- 1 Can Fruit
- 1 Can Chunky Soup
- 3 Different Cans Vegetables
- 1 Jar Peanut Butter
- 1 Jar Jelly
- 1 Box Cereal
- 1 Tube Crackers
- 1 Pouch Powdered Milk
- 1 Holiday Treat, such as Cookies, Peanuts, Granola, or Popcorn
